# WHO'S IN CHARGE?

STANDING STRONG IN A HOSTILE CULTURE

THE BOOK OF DANIEL

Daniel 1:1-2; 2:28; 4:17; 4:37b

#### Introduction:

Theme: He's Got the Whole World In His Hands Written: 530 BC Author: Daniel (605BC – 536BC) Setting: Babylon

#### Attacks on the Authenticity of the Book of Daniel:

- HISTORY Critics say Daniel written 164 BC (not 530 BC), and is a forgery. [Ez. 14:14 "Though these three men Noah, Daniel, and Job;" Ez. 28:3 – "Behold, you are wiser than Daniel." – Ezekiel is referencing a contemporary by the name of Daniel.]
- 2) LANGUAGE Critics use Daniel 3:5, which describes musical instruments, the terms written in Greek (unknown at the time).
- 3) MIRACLES 3 Hebrew children in Fiery Furnace / Daniel in Lion's Den
- 4) PROPHECY How could Daniel know all of those prophecies? [Daniel 9:24-26 is an example of Prophecy fulfilled]

#### 8 Proofs that Daniel is a Historical Character and He Wrote the Book of Daniel:

- 1) Ez. 28:3; 14:14 Ezekiel, who wrote about 600BC, mentions Daniel as a true historical character.
- 2) Hebrew Bible (OT), Daniel is in the Hebrew Bible, and the Jews were very careful. No prophecy was written after 400BC, yet Daniel is written before this. They rejected 1 and 2 Maccabees (14 books in all),
- 3) Septuagint (dates 275-300BC) Daniel is in there. How can scholars say Daniel was written 135 BC
- 4) Dead Sea Scrolls (sections of Daniel in them) date several hundred years BC. "[T]he book of Daniel was accepted as canonical by the community of Qumran (who produced the Dead Sea Scrolls). This is telling because this group emerged as a separate party in Judaism between 171 and 167 b.c., before the proposed late date."<sup>a</sup>
- 5) Jesus Himself Matthew 24:15 Jesus does not speak of Daniel the deceiver or forger, but "the prophet".
- 6) Other New Testament allusions to Daniel 2 Timothy 4:17, 2 Thess. 2:3, Heb. 11:33-34
- 7) Fulfilled Prophecies Half of Daniel has been fulfilled. 8-12<sup>th</sup> chapters.
- 8) It fits like a glove in the Book of Revelation.

# 4) SUFFERING

See Romans 8:28

# 5) SALVATION

God's Sovereignty - Ephesians 1:5, 6, 11

Our responsibility - 2 Peter 3:9; Matthew 23:37; 1 Timothy 2:3-4

God predestined a PLAN of salvation (CHRIST), not an individual PERSON to be saved.

#### 6) SELF

See Proverbs 20:24 and Proverbs 16:9
