James 1:19-27

How to Make Your Bible a Blessing:

- 1. Be RECEPTIVE to God's Word (v.19-20, 23-25)
 - Quick to Hear (attentive to the Word see Prov. 4:20-22)
 - Slow to Speak (slow to argue with the Word)
 - Slow to Wrath (slow to get offended at the Word)
 - Receive with Meekness (see Acts 17:11; 1 Thess. 2:13)
 - o "accept and submit to the Word which has been planted" the Jerusalem Bible
 - The word "receive" is translated several times in the New Testament as "welcome" (Matt. 10:40; Gal. 4:14; Heb. 11:31 Ph)
- 2. REPENT of all known sin (v. 21)
 - Filthiness = wax in the ears
 - Overflow of wickedness an weed-infested garden (overgrown)
- 3. RESPOND to God's Word (v.22, 26-27)

Three Evidences of Genuine Faith:

- 1. controlled speech (v.26)
- 2. compassionate service (v.27)
- 3. clean separation from the world (v.27)
