WHO'S ON THE THRONE? Setting the tone in your home

Fall is here, and with it likely new schedules & activities. How do you navigate the busyness of life while leading your family to put God first? How do you set the tone for your family in a way that honors God? You can start by asking this question:

What (or Whom) do we worship?

Shane Pruitt famously said,

Sports can be good, but they can't be God.

In other words, there are many things that can be good for your family: education, sports, theater, community service, etc., but they can never take the first place that God deserves.

So how do you know what's first place in your life and avoid putting something good in the spot reserved for what's best?

To answer "What do we worship?" Consider asking: "For what do we sacrifice?" instead.

Sacrifice and worship go hand and hand all throughout God's word. When you consider to what you are sacrificing your time, energy, resources, and schedule, you get a clearer picture of what you are worshipping. When you sacrifice, you acknowledge that the one to whom you are sacrificing is far more worthy than that thing you sacrifice. To get a quick "check up" on what you worship, consider to what (or to whom) you sacrifice your time, energy, resources and schedule.

Your family is strongest when they aren't in 1st place

God created families as a blessing. He delights in your love and devotion to your spouse and children. However, He knows that your family cannot live up to first place in your life; that spot is reserved for Him as Savior and Lord. We are created with a need for salvation, peace and joy that is only possible through Jesus Christ. Expecting your family to satisfy those deepest needs is too heavy- a responsibility they aren't able to carry.

When you put God in first place, He perfectly satisfies. Once you have recognized God for who He is, you can love your family for who they are more peacefully, joyfully and completely. Consider your time spent in Bible study, prayer, and worship an

your time spent in Bible study, prayer, and worship an investment not only into your relationship with your Savior but also an investment in your family's well-being. Time spent with Jesus is always time well-spent for you & for the ones you love.
