

## **ARTS BREAKOUT DESCRIPTIONS:**

**Acrobatics:** Children will participate in a variety of acrobatic-type activities, which will be showcased during the final presentation. Children should know some basic gymnastics skills, such as somersaults and cartwheels.

**Art**: Children will participate in visual arts experiences, including painting, drawing, and other crafts, which will be displayed during the Friday night production.

**Choir:** Children will participate in the choir, singing the music that will accompany the other arts presentations and connect the scenes within the drama during the Friday night production.

**Dance**: Children will learn and memorize choreography and dance movements, to present to the audience during the Friday night production.

**Drama**: The drama group is for those children who are cast in an acting part after being chosen through the audition process. Children must be able to attend auditions on Sunday, July 7 from 4:00 – 6:00 pm and must be able to attend the final production on Friday, August 2 at 6:30 pm.

**Drumming/Percussion**: Children will play various ethnic drums and percussion instruments (such as bongos, hand drums, djembes, frame drums, boomwhackers) and learn a group piece of music to present to the audience during the Friday night production.

**Photography:** Children will learn basic photography skills and take photos throughout the week of camp. The photos will be compiled into a slide show which will be shown during the Friday night production.

**Puppetry**: Children will learn how to use puppets in presenting the gospel. They will prepare a puppet piece and present their final work during the Friday night production.

**Snack Chefs:** Children will create the snacks that will be served daily to the campers during snack time. All snacks will be theme-based to go along with the subject of the musical.

**Stage Hands:** Children will learn skills that assist with the backstage elements of production, including helping with set, props, wardrobe changes, and preparing and moving various equipment according to set requirements. This group is limited to children in  $3^{rd}$  –  $5^{th}$  grade.

**Stop Motion Technology:** Children will learn how to use stop motion animation and create a video to be shared during the Friday night production. Stop motion animation is a filming technique in which objects (such as clay models) are photographed in a series of slightly different positions so that the objects seem to move. Children will be required to provide his/her own portable device, such as a tablet or smartphone.
