


Persevering Through Unanswered Prayers

- Philippians 3:10 that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death

Walking in Faith in the Desert


Biblical example - Abraham's faith - Romans 4:18-21

Denial of Reality

Biblical example – Kings of Israel and Judah who did not listen to the prophets' warnings – 1 Kings 22:7-38

Determination to overcome

Biblical example – Sarah's impatience in having a son Genesis16:2



Despair without hope

Biblical example – Paul's struggles and hardship 2 Corinthians 1:8-10

What is the desert?

• The desert is the time of waiting on the Lord when the promises of God and the prayers based on the character of God are not yet fulfilled in our lives.

Why does God allow us to go through the desert?

- Conform us to the image of Jesus 1 Peter 1:6-7
- Draw us closer to Him and help us to know His character more deeply Exodus 34:6-7
- Show us idols in our lives golden calf Exodus 32
- Use our response to the suffering to bring God glory 2 Corinthians 4:7-11

How do we persevere in prayer through the desert?

- Find our hope in God Psalms 130
- Cling to the promises and character of God 2 Peter 1:2-4
- Praising and thanking God in our circumstances 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18
- Praying for the "mana" that you need each day Luke 11:3
- Discipline of lament Express your emotions to God in a healthy way
 - Turn to God in prayer
 - Pour out your heart
 - Ask boldly
 - o Choose to trust
- Trust God to be with you Psalms 23, Isaiah 43:2
