God's Mission to the Gentiles
Acts 13:14-52

I. FOUNDATION: ISRAEL'S PROVIDENTIAL HISTORY (Acts 13:16-25)

Paul's Historical Foundation: Ten Divine Actions:

- 1. "The God of this people Israel chose our fathers" (v.17a) Sovereign election of the patriarchs.
- 2. "and exalted the people when they dwelt as strangers in the land of Egypt" (v.17b) Supernatural growth despite oppression.
- 3. "and with an uplifted arm He brought them out of it" (v.17c) Miraculous deliverance from bondage.
- 4. "He put up with their ways in the wilderness" (v.18) Patient endurance of their rebellion for 40 years.
- 5. "when He had destroyed seven nations in the land of Canaan" (v.19a) Military victory over superior enemies.
- 6. "He distributed their land to them by allotment" (v.19b) The Promised Land as God's gift, not Israel's achievement.
- 7. "He gave them judges for about four hundred and fifty years" (v.20) Divine deliverance through repeated cycles of rebellion.
- 8. "so God gave them Saul the son of Kish" (v.21) Their first king granted in displeasure at their rejection of God's rule.
- 9. "when He had removed him, He raised up for them David as king" (v.22) Replacement of the disobedient king with "a man after My own heart".
- 10. "God raised up for Israel a Savior—Jesus" (v.23) The ultimate fulfillment of the Davidic covenant promise.

The Pattern: History is "His Story"! God is the primary Actor in all of Israel's history. Their unfaithfulness never nullified His faithfulness. Every promise finds ultimate fulfillment in Jesus Christ.

II. FACTS: THE MESSAGE OF THE GOSPEL (Acts 13:26-31)

- A. The Target Audience (v.26) The Gospel is for both ethnic Israel and Gentile believers.
- **B.** The Tragic Rejection (vv.27-28) Ignorance of Scripture leads to rejection of the Living Word.
- **C.** The Triumphant Resurrection (vv.29-31) The resurrection has eyewitness verification.

III. FULFILLMENT: OLD TESTAMENT PROPHECIES (Acts 13:32-37)

- A. The Promise Fulfilled (vv.32-33a) "And we declare to you glad tidings—that promise which was made to the fathers. God has fulfilled this for us their children, in that He has raised up Jesus" Every Old Testament promise finds its "Yes" in Christ.
- B. The Prophetic Proof (vv.33b-37) Three Key Prophecies Fulfilled:
 - Psalm 2:7 "You are My Son, Today I have begotten You" (v.33b) Christ's divine sonship confirmed through resurrection.
 - Isaiah 55:3 "I will give you the sure mercies of David" (v.34) The Messianic covenant established forever.
 - Psalm 16:10 "You will not allow Your Holy One to see corruption" (v.35) A Bodily resurrection prophesied.
 - Other prophecies Genesis 3:15; Isaiah 7:14; Isaiah 9:6; Micah 5:2; Genesis 12:2-3; Numbers 24:17;
 Isaiah 11:1; Zechariah 9:9; Psalm 41:19; Zechariah 11:12
- **C.** The David Contrast (vv.36-37) David died and decayed; Jesus died and rose.

IV. FRUIT: RECEPTION AND REJECTION (Acts 13:38-52)

- **A.** Salvation is through faith alone (vv.38-39)
- B. Rejection will bring judgment (vv.40-41)
- **C.** Responses can be surprising (vv.42-52): Initial Interest (v.42), Growing Opposition (v.45), Gentile Acceptance (v.48)
 - V.48 Note: "It is difficult to miss the doctrine of God's election here; the words 'were appointed' come from the verb $tass\bar{o}$, a military word meaning 'to arrange' or 'to assign.' Luke used it here to show that God's elective decree included Gentiles."
- **D.** Results are two fold: "And the word of the Lord was being spread throughout all the region" (v.49) and "the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit" (v.52)

APPLICATIONS FOR TODAY:

- 1. Feed the spiritually hungry, focus your energy wisely. You cannot feed people who refuse to eat.²
- 2. Examine your own heart for rejected truth.
- 3. Respond to opposition with Spirit-filled joy.
- 4. Don't view ministry success by crowd size but by commitment to God's Word.
